WHEREAS, the Korean War was fought from June 25, 1950, through July 27, 1953; and

WHEREAS, more than 1.5 million American men and women served in the Korean War; and

WHEREAS, the Korean War was one of the bloodiest wars in history, with more than 34,000 Americans killed in action, approximately 103,000 wounded, and more than 7,900 missing; and

WHEREAS, more than 294,000 Floridians were the uniform of the Armed Forces of the United States during the Korean War; and

WHEREAS, more than 178,000 Korean War veterans currently reside in Florida; and

WHEREAS, June 25, 2013, is the 63<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the beginning of the Korean War; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Defense is honoring the service and sacrifice of Korean War veterans, commemorating key events of the war, and educating Americans about the historical significance of the war; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that all Floridians honor America's Korean War veterans, through whose service and sacrifice we today enjoy freedom and liberty;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rick Scott, Governor of the State of Florida, do hereby extend greetings and best wishes to all observing June 25, 2013, as *Korean War Remembrance Day*.
