Operating as the premier point of entry for Florida's 1.5 million veterans, FDVA operates a network of nine state Veterans' homes and provides statewide outreach to connect veterans with their earned services, benefits and support. The agency's Veterans' claims examiners play a major role in the direct infusion of more than \$23.9 billion annually for veterans into Florida's economy through federal compensation, education and pension benefits, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' medical services and military retired pay.

Alwyn C. Cashe

The Alwyn C. Cashe State Veterans' Nursing Home is named after Sgt. Alwyn C. Cashe of the U.S. Army. Sqt. Cashe was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor in recognition of his outstanding acts of bravery and commitment to his fellow soldiers. While on night patrol in Iraq Sgt. Cashe's Bradley fighting vehicle ignited in flames after encountering an improved explosive device. He heroically retrieved six soldiers and an interpreter from a burning vehicle receiving burns to nearly 72% of his body.

Admission

Basic admission requirements include an honorable discharge from the Armed Forces, Florida residency prior to admission and certification of need of skilled nursing care as determined by a VA physician. Upon admission, each resident is given a checkup by the staff physician to ensure all medical information is current. For additional information, call 407-741-4613.
