

## Raymond L. Miller



Retired Marine Corps Master Sergeant Raymond L. Miller was named Chief Operating Officer of the Florida Veterans Foundation on February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. Before the foundation, Mr. Miller was the Director of Tallahassee National Cemetery, effective Nov. 2, 2014. His responsibilities included all burial, maintenance, and administrative operations at the cemetery. Prior to this assignment, Mr. Miller was the Director of Memphis, Little Rock and Corinth National Cemetery in Tennessee, Arkansas, and Mississippi from April 2012; Director of Wood National Cemetery in Milwaukee, WI. from October 2010; and Assistant to the Director of Willamette National Cemetery in Portland, Oregon from April 2010.

Mr. Miller completed the National Cemetery
Administration (NCA) comprehensive, year-long Cemetery
Director Intern Program in April 2010. He joined NCA in
2005 at Camp Butler National Cemetery in Springfield,

Illinois. He attended the NCA Gardener and Tree Care Course in St. Louis and completed the Master Gardener Course and Tree Identification Course through the University of Illinois extension office.

Mr. Miller retired from the U.S. Marine Corps as a Master Sergeant, after serving 21.5 years. His tours included the U.S Embassy in Londo,n England and Manama, Bahrain, and Chicago where he was awarded the Marine Corps non-commissioned officer sword for leading the top recruiting sub-station in the region. He also served in with 1<sup>st</sup> BN. 5<sup>th</sup> Marines during the Gulf War. Mr. Miller earned an associate degree from Lincoln Land Community College.
